

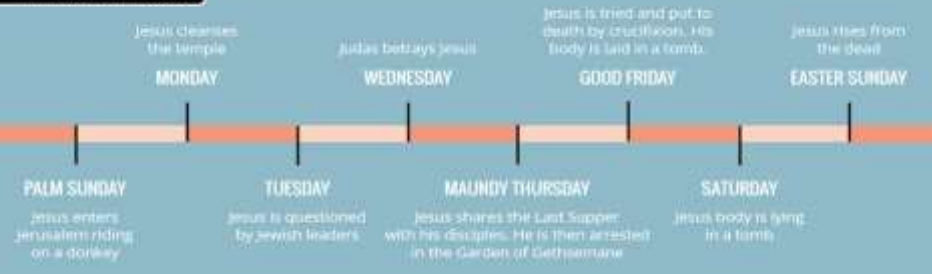

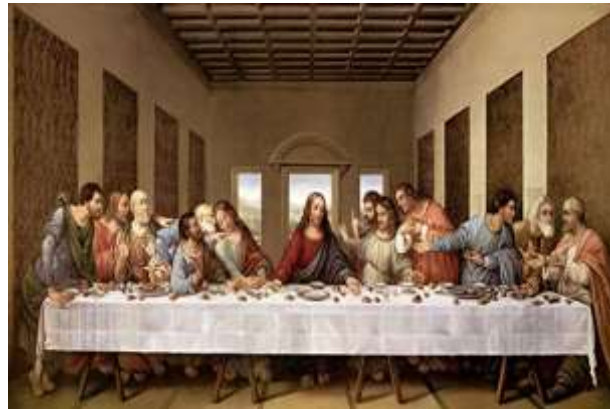
Why do Christians celebrate the Eucharist?

| Key vocabulary | Definition   |
|----------------|--|
| Eucharist      | A Christian service, ceremony, or sacrament commemorating the Last Supper, in which bread and wine are consecrated and consumed.   |
| Holy Communion | Another name for Eucharist.  |
| Last Supper    | The final meal that Jesus shared with his disciples in Jerusalem before his crucifixion. This day became known as Maundy Thursday. |
| Sacrifice      | Jesus offering himself to be crucified.  |
| Salvation      | Being free from sin as a result of Jesus' death.   |
| Sacrament      | A Christian service that has consecrated elements.   |
| Consecrated    | To be made holy.   |

### TIMELINE OF HOLY WEEK



Leonardo da Vinci's *The Last Supper* is one of the most admired, most studied, and most reproduced paintings the world has ever known.



"...When He had given thanks, He broke [the bread] and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same manner He also took the cup [of wine] after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me'" (1 Corinthians 11:24-25).

As Jews, Jesus and his disciples were in Jerusalem to celebrate Passover, the Passover meal was to be Jesus' last meal with his friends.
